## 1968 Junior Festivals Report

The response to our call for Festival participation in 1968 has been overwhelming. It is with much pride we report an extensive increase in Festival Entrants in the 1968 Season. There are two kinds of people, "Those who Lift and those who Lean." A special "Thanks" to our Junior Counselors who are always among those who "Lift."

It is exciting to report that one state made a gain of 20% to capture first place in the Nation, namely Louisiana. With an increase of over 300 entrants the former first place winner, Iowa, needed to bow to second place. We feel certain North Carolina had wished to honor the National President by seeking "first place" (and the state's total number of entrants did exceed the 1967 first place winner), but nevertheless the state came to list in third place.
