



### String Competition Report

Three String Auditions were held 11 May 1975. The Junior Group, grades four through six played at the studio of June Trayhern located at 1711 Kirby Road, Mc Lean, Virginia at 2:30 P. M. The Intermediate Group, grades seven through nine played at the Woman's Club of Arlington 700 South Buchanan Street, Arlington, Virginia at 1:00 P. M. The Senior Group, grades ten through twelve played at the same location at 6:00 P. M.

Adjudicators for the Junior Group were EdwinJohonnott, Sheldon Lampert, both violinists from the National Symphony and Michael Jones s violist to from USAF.

Adjudicators for the Intermediate Group were Mary Price, concertmistress of the Arlington Symphony and Walter Schwede USAF, violinists and David Howard, cellist from the National Symphony.

Adjudicators for the Senior Group were Nina Collins, George Riley USAF both violinists and Ervin Klinkon cellist at Montomery College, Rockville, Maryland.

A letter was mailed to string teachers on the mailing list in September stating that the competition was open only to members of NVMTA teachers. This resulted in three new string members at that time and also to three new members at the time of securing judges. The letter announcing the event and setting up rules was mailed in January. A charge for entry was made. This fee was \$3.

Thirty applications were received. Twenty nine played. There were nine entries in the Junior, eight violinists and one cellist. They all played. There were twelve entries in the Intermediate, one viola, four cellos and seven violins. They all played. There were nine entries in the Senior, one did not play. Six violins and two cellos played.

- The winner of the Junior Group was David Dillard, student of Carlton Herrett. Runner up was Steven John Patti, student of Neva Greenwood.
- The winner of the Intermediate Group was Virgilio JovenJrstudent of Carlton Herrett. The judges recommended that the second place winner also be awarded a money prize. The secondplace winner was Julie Gigante, student of Carlton Herrett. The judges bestowed honorable mention to Theresa Louise Whiley, who was our money winner in the Junior Group in 1974. She is a student of Virginia Gardner.
- The winner of the Senior Group was AliceTaylor, who was a money winner in 1973 in a lower category. She is a student of Robert Hofmekler. The judges could not agree on a second place winner because in their opinion there were three players that rated equally for second place.

This year Carleton Herrett initiated a drive to up the amount of money that our club gives to string players. He felt that this would give our club more prestige. \*Several of our own membership contributed to this fund: Barbara Inzana, Ellis Chasens, June Trayhern, William.
