PLEASE CALL NEWSLETTER ITEMS to June Trayhern, 356-2676, at least ten days before the date of the next meeting.



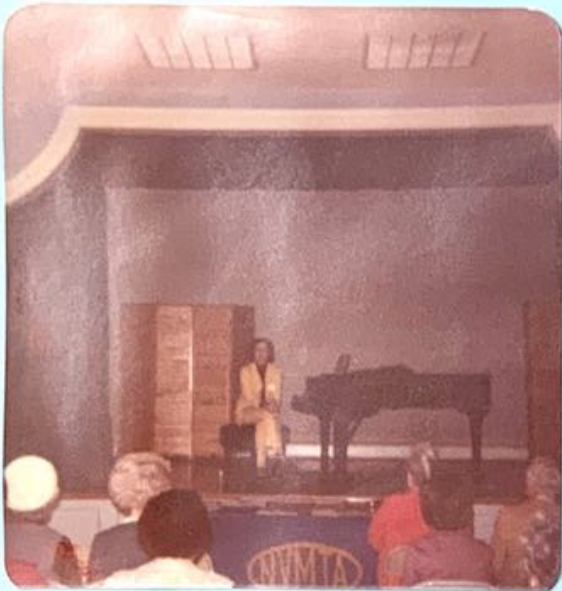
