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

3. A Virtuoso Piece

4. Two Short Pieces (Counting as one) of contrasting styles and periods

Playing Time:

Junior 6 minutes

Intermediate 8 minutes

Senior 12 minutes

The teacher and student together are responsible for planning the timing. The entrant must know in advance which piece he is to play first and at what place he plans to start the second piece. The copies of the music furnished the judges should indicate this information. If the Junior entrant has not started the second piece at the end of 4 minutes playing time the timer will give a signal to start the second piece. He will not be stopped until the end of the 6 minute period if he starts his second piece by the end of the 4-minute period. If the Intermediate or Senior entrant has not started his second piece at the end of 5 minutes playing time the timer will give a signal to start the second piece. He will not be stopped until the end of the alotted time if he makes the change by himself.

The teacher, a member of NVMTA, must teach privately and maintain a studio in the Northern Virginia area. The judges are not permitted to converse with the entrant except to congratulate him after the winners have been announced. The entrant must furnish 3 copies of each selection. One copy is for the use of each judge. The entrant must furnish his own accompanist.

The Northern Virginia Music Teachers Association has had a busy and productive year in 1983-84. Our programs have included a major Orientation meeting at the beginning of the year, a theory workshop, and a program of new compositions, largely by American composers. We also had a Parade of American Music Program of the American composers' approach to prepared piano presented by Susan Faulkner, and a Crusade for Strings program of three high school students of Carlton Herrett playing violin concerti.

Our May meeting will be followed by a recital given by the winners of this year's Scholarship Competition. We were able to hold scholarship competitions in Strings, Voice, Woodwinds, Brass and Piano. We also held a Concerto Competition in those same five categories with the winners playing with the Mt. Vernon Chamber Orchestra at the Alexandria BiCentennial Center.

NVMTA held a benefit concert for our scholarship fund. Members of the club preformed a beautiful chamber concert of flute, voice, piano, oboe, and clarinet. Our yearly pecan sale was a major contributor to our scholarship fund. Besides the many music stores who have contributed to the fund in the past, we were able to get contributions from some large, nonmusic-related businesses this year.

NVMTA sponsors a yearly Composition Festival, which is a growing success. It was run by Jo Lombard, a club member and composer who has introduced some of her music to the club. We are also proud to have welcomed another female composer, Hansi Alt, as a member of NVMTA.

One of this year's biggest successes was the Junior Festival. We had three co-chairmen, Jacqa Yeomans, Nancy Breth, and Jean Sallee who were all new to the Festival, and yet who ran it extremely well. We hope to start a computerized festival this coming year.

With our 200 active members, NVMTA is still growing, with many new and active members. We look forward to the coming year and all of its possibilities.
